FLORIDA PRESTRESSED CONCRETE ASSOCIATION, INC.
ANTI-TRUST COMPLIANCE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

It shall be the policy of the Florida Prestressed Concrete Association, Inc. to be in strict compliance to all Federal and State Anti-Trust Rules and Regulations, therefore:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the following are adopted as the Florida Prestressed Concrete Association, Inc. Anti-Trust Policies and Procedures:

1. These policies and procedures apply to all membership, board, committee and other meetings sponsored by the Association, all meetings attended by representatives of the Association and to The Association's employees in all of their activities within the scope of their employment.
2. All meetings of the Association whether membership, board, committee or any other type of meeting sponsored by the Association, shall be conducted as though they were open to the public.
3. Discussions of prices or price levels is prohibited. In addition, no discussion is permitted of any elements of a company's operations which might influence price such as: a. company cost of operations, supplies, labor or services; b. allowance for discounts; c. terms of sale including credit arrangements, and d. profit margins and mark-ups, provided this limitation shall not extend to discussions of methods of operation, maintenance, and similar matters in which cost or efficiency is merely incidental.
4. It is a violation of the anti-trust laws to agree not to compete, therefore, discussion of division of territories or customers or limitations on the nature of business carried on or products sold are not permitted.
5. Boycotts in any form are unlawful. Discussion relating to boycotts is prohibited, including discussions about blacklisting or unfavorable reports about particular companies including their financial situation.
6. It is the Association's policy that all meetings attended by representatives of the Association where discussion can border on an area of anti-trust sensitivity, that the Association's representative request that the discussion be stopped and ask that the request be made a part of the minutes of the meeting being attended. If others continue such discussion, the Association's representative should excuse himself from the meeting at that point and why he left. Any such instances should be reported immediately to the President of the Association and through him a legal counsel so that the matter can be reviewed and a determination be made as to the necessity of further action by the Association.
7. It is the Association's policy that a copy of these Anti-Trust Compliance Procedures and Policies be given to each director, committee member, official representative of member companies and Association employees annually and that the same be read as the first order of business to all members of the membership of the Association.
8. A prepare Agenda will be written and followed at all meetings. Particular attention will be paid to avoiding discussions as outlined in Paragraph 3 heretofore.
9. Formal minutes of all meetings will be written and filed.



Meeting Code of Conduct

(Revised September 2017)

In order to provide all participants with the opportunity to benefit from FPCA events and activities, FPCA is committed to providing a friendly, safe, supportive and harassment-free environment for all meeting attendees and participants, regardless of gender, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, disability, physical appearance, body size, race, ethnicity, religion or other group identity.

This code of conduct outlines FPCA's expectations for all meeting attendees and participants, including all members, guests of member, speakers, vendors, media representatives, commentators, exhibitors, sponsors and volunteers. Cooperation is expected from everyone and organizers will actively enforce this code throughout this event. Violations will be taken seriously.

Expected Behavior

FPCA expects meeting participants to communicate professionally and constructively, whether in person or virtually, handling dissent or disagreement with courtesy, dignity and an open mind, being respectful when providing feedback, and being open to alternate points of view. Likewise, when sharing information about the organization or any attendees or participants via public communication channels, FPCA expects participants to share responsibly and clearly distinguish individual opinion from fact.

Alcohol is available at evening social networking events during the meeting and may be consumed only by those of legal age. Alcohol at FPCA events will only be distributed by commercial hosts following local and state statutes, which may include limiting consumption.

Unacceptable Behavior

FPCA does not tolerate harassment of meeting attendees or participants in any form. Harassment includes offensive verbal or written comments, and negative behavior, either in real or virtual space, including those which are related to or are based upon gender, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, disability, physical appearance, body size, race, ethnicity, religion or other group identity. Harassment also includes deliberate intimidation, stalking, following, harassing photography or recording, sustained disruption of talks or other events, and unwelcome physical contact or sexual attention.

Alcohol may not be brought into FPCA-sponsored events nor may alcohol be consumed by those not of legal age. Because excessive alcohol leads to impaired decision-making, FPCA strongly discourages excessive drinking at any point during the meeting.

Consequences of Unacceptable Behavior

If an attendee or participant, in either real or virtual space, engages in inappropriate, harassing, abusive or destructive behavior or language, the meeting organizers and FPCA Leadership will determine and carry out the appropriate course of action, including warning the offender, expulsion from the meeting with no refund and/or banning the offender from future FPCA events and activities.

All participants are expected to observe these rules and behaviors in all meeting venues, including online venues and meeting social events. Meeting participants seek to learn, network and enjoy themselves in the process, free from any type of harassment. Please participate responsibly and with respect for the rights of others.
